



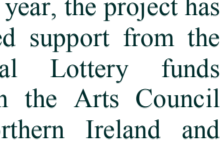

On the weekend of 9-10-11, it will be five years since the British government gave its commitment at St Andrews that it would enact the Irish Language Act, something which it has so far failed to do. On 9-10-11, Irish speakers will put the Irish Language Act centre stage once more, and have a fantastic day out with the Irish language arts at the same time!'

Le bliain go leith anuas tá grúpa oibre ag obair faoi scáth POBAL agus é mar aidhm aige creatlach straitéise 20 bliain a lean gan amach don Ghaeilge i dTuaisceart Éireann, comhthreomhar le Straitéis 20 Bliain an Deiscirt. Tá Institiúidí 3ú leibhéal páirteach sa ghrúpa seo - Ollscoil na Banríona, Ollscoil Uladh agus Coláiste Oideachais Naomh Muire, na Meán Chumarsáide, POBAL féin agus an earnáil Oideachais. Mhínigh Dónall Ó Baoill, Cathaoirleach an Ghrúpa Oibre, go raibh Comhdháil lae againn anuraidh in Ostán Stormont, áit ar labhair daoine as Éirinn thuaidh agus theas agus ó Chomhairle na hEorpa. Mar thoradh ar an Chomhdháil sin, socraíodh leanúint ar aghaidh leis an obair agus doiciméad níos beaichte agus níos cinnte a chur ar fáil don phobal ar fad. Chomh maith leis sin foilsíodh páimfléad i nGaeilge agus i mBéarla ina bhfuil cur síos ar ar thit amach ag an Chomhdháil lae in Ostán Stormont. Lena chois sin chuir Janet Muller agus Dónall P. Ó Baoill páipéar i láthair ag Comhdháilcha éagsúla in Ollscoil na Banríona agus i mBaile Atha Cliath. Foilsíodh na cainteanna ó Chomhdháil Ollscoil na Banríona le deireanas. CONFERENCE

Draft Strategic Framework for Irish in NI
St. Mary's College of Education, Falls Road, Belfast
Wednesday, 28/09/2011 - 1:30-5:00 pm

A working group has been meeting under the umbrella of POBAL for the last 18 months with the aim of producing a 20 year Draft Strategic for Irish in Northern Ireland, in parallel with the 20 year strategy published by the Dublin Government in 2010. The working group has representation from Queen's University, the University of Ulster and St. Mary's College of Education, from the Media, from POBAL and the Educational Sector. Dónall Ó Baoill, Chair of the Working Group explained that a one-day Conference was held last year in the Stormont Hotel which was addressed by speakers from Ireland, both North and South and from the Council of Europe. Arising from the success of this Conference, it was agreed to continue with the work at hand and to prepare a more concise and up to date factual document for the whole community. Subsequently, a bilingual pamphlet was published in Irish and English, which contains the papers presented at the Symposium. Janet Muller and Dónall P. Ó Baoill have also made presentations at different symposia elsewhere at Queen's University and in Dublin. The papers from the Queen's University Symposia were published in August 2011. Janet Muller and Dónall P. Ó Baoill also met with representatives from Sinn Féin and the SDLP at Stormont and summarised and explained the work we are undertaking.

In the meantime, the working group decided to set up two sub-groups dealing specifically with Education and the Media. Membership of these subgroups included people with expertise in each of the two disciplines. They have now reported the outcomes of their research and deliberations in two short publications. At this point, we would like to present the information we have accumulated on legislation, the media, education and other areas to a larger public audience in the hope of improving and agreeing a final published document. It is expected that a short document will be published containing the main core elements of the strategy and that further relevant information will be made available at the following address www.pobal.org. A comprehensive document detailing the required legislation necessary to implement and administer the strategy has also been prepared. As part of our ongoing campaign, we have decided to hold a half-day Conference on the 28th September, to tease out, discuss and improve the content of the present documentation and to give further direction and advice to the working group. The Conference will be held in St. Mary's College of Education starting and 1:30 pm and finishing at 5:00pm.

Culture Minister launches Líofa 2015

The Culture Minister, Carál Ní Chúilín, launched the **Líofa 2015** campaign in Stormont on September 5th, a project which aims to encourage 1000 people from all walks of life across the North to sign up to becoming fluent in Irish by the year 2015.

On the DCAL website the Minister says, 'I recognise that, in the past, Gaelic culture, and the Irish language in particular, has been the subject of political disagreement and perceived as the preserve of one section of our community. However, I believe that the rich cultural and linguistic heritage on this island is something that we all share and something that we should all embrace and enjoy. Therefore, I intend to introduce measures aimed at de-politicising the Irish language and returning it to a status where it can be practiced and enjoyed by people of all backgrounds and traditions. This is obviously a challenging target and will require a significant degree of commitment from the participants involved but I am greatly encouraged by the discussions I have already had with stakeholders from across the community and I firmly believe this is a realistic goal.'

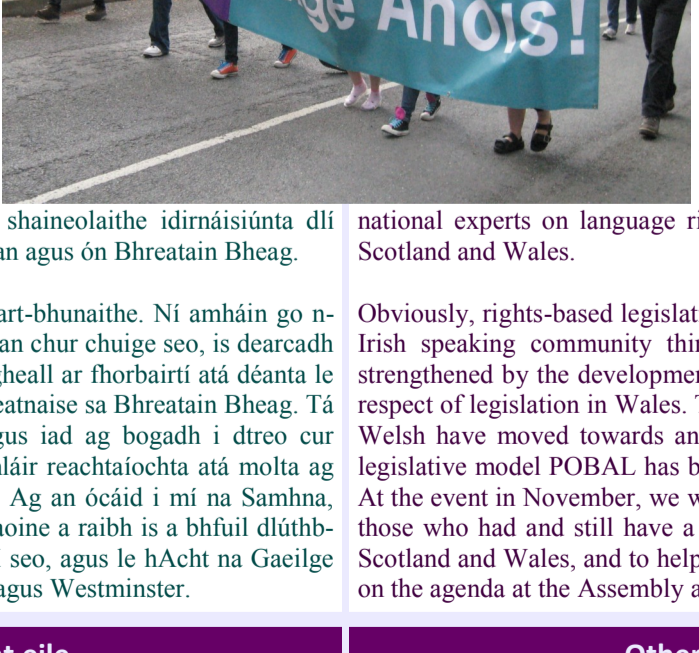

Even though the atmosphere is more positive now than it has been for some time, it is still obvious that Irish speakers will need to show strong, loud support for an Irish Language Act for the North that is rights-based, comprehensive and strong. It is clear that there is still some way to go before we get legislation that will be capable of protecting and promoting the language properly. Irish speakers have to struggle every day for recognition, for rights and for services in Irish. We need significant improvement in every walk of life. To move this process forward, POBAL is organising a major one day event on Wednesday 16th November in the Long Gallery at Stormont. Minister Caral Ní Chúilín will open the event, and there will be input from politicians, from the community and from international experts on language rights and the law from Ireland, Scotland and Wales.

Obviously, rights-based legislation is needed. But it is the Irish speaking community think this way, not only is a view strengthened by the developments in the last couple of years in respect of legislation in Wales. There has been progress, and the Welsh have moved towards an approach that is similar to the legislative model POBAL has been proposing for several years. At the event in November, we will have the chance to hear from those who had and still have a central role in developments in Scotland and Wales, and to help put the Irish language Act back on the agenda at the Assembly and at Westminster.
