### Irish language event draws people from far and near to call for the Irish language Act

St George's market in Belfast was buzzing on Sunday with thousands of people of all ages who had come from far and near for POBAL's massive Irish language Rights and Revelry event to celebrate the achievements of the Irish language community and to call for the fulfilment of the St Andrews Agreement promise to enact Irish language legislation. Janet Muller, POBAL's Chief Executive said, 'This year's event has been even

bigger and better than last year, and we have had a fantastic family fun day of arts and entertainment and a serious message – four years after St Andrews, it's time for the Irish language Act.'

She continued, 'POBAL's Rights and Revelry has become a ground breaking get together for Irish speakers from all over the country to celebration of the work that the Irish speaking community carries out all year round and it means we can showcase our achievements to a massive audience.!'

The list of amazing events during the day included the heart-stopping Belfast Circus high-wire act and the mad-cap Fanzini Brothers Cannonball Show topping the bill.

Renowned author Séamas Mac Annaidh held a storytelling workshop; historian and Shaw's Road Gaeltacht founder, Brighid Mhic Sheáin guided a short historical tour of the markets area; there was hip-hop in Irish, children's drama, modern dance with Tura Arutura, arts and drama workshops with Aisling Óg, games, the fun Bungee Run, face painting, and a chance to try out pipe reeds (and to make rude noises). Tony Devlin, well-known film, TV and stage actor, introduced the main stage entertainment, including circus spectacle, music, dance and song. As well as directing the current stage hit, 'A Night with George,' Tony has many Hollywood and TV credits to his name including 'Hart's War',

'Breakfast on Pluto', 'H3', 'Titanic Town', 'Band of Brothers', 'Marú' and 'Observe the Sons of Ulster'. He appears regularly on TV in both Irish and English, including in adverts for a well-known brand of lager!

Janet Muller said, 'We have had people here from every part of Belfast, and from Dungiven, Maghera, Strabane, Ballycastle, Fermanagh, Newry, Armagh and Derry – every county in the North and not forgetting all those who travelled from Dublin, Kerry and other parts too! The need for the Irish language Act is rooted in the fantastic work of Irish speakers all over the country, and particularly in the North – the only place on these islands where there is not already extensive protection under law for the primary indigenous language. This weekend it is four years since the British government gave its commitment at St Andrews that it would enact the Irish Language Act, something which it has so far failed to do. On 10.10.10, Irish speakers have put the Irish Language Act centre stage once more, and had a fantastic day out at the same time!'
