

Ardaíonn POBAL ceist Acht na Gaeilge i Stoirmhondh arís

POBAL brings the Irish Language Act back to Stormont

Céadaoin 16ú Samhain, Gailearaí Fada, Stoirmhondh

Wednesday 16th November, Long Gallery, Stormont

Tá Gaeilgeoirí ag ullmhú le dul in ngleic le castacht Acht na Gaeilge i Stoirmhondh arís, agus ar an ócáid seo beidh an tAire Cultúir agus duine dá comhfheisirí aontachtacha ag tacú leis an chuireadh. Tá POBAL, an scátheagras atá ar thús cadhnaíochta maidir le hobair ar reachtaíocht Ghaeilge sa tuaisceart, ag obair faoi chuireadh comhpháirteach ó Charal Ní Chuilín, an t-Aire Cultúir, Ealaíon agus Fóillíochta sa Tuaisceart, agus ó Basil McCrea CTR, Páirtí Aontachtach Uladh le Gaeilgeoirí, saineolaithe idirnáisiúnta ar dhíf teanga, rama rialtais agus ionadaithe na sochaí shibhialta a bhailiú le chéile d'imeacht lae: Acht na Gaeilge TÉ, a bheidh ar siúl sa Ghaillearaí Fada, Foirmhinn na Parlaiminte, Stoirmhondh ar 9.45-4.30, Dé Céadaoin 16ú Samhain 2011.

Irish speakers are getting ready to get to grips with the nitty gritty of the Irish language Act at Stormont once more, and this time the Minister for Culture and one of her unionist colleagues are supporting the invitation. POBAL, the umbrella organisation which has spearheaded the work for legislation in the north is working under a joint invitation from Carol Ní Chuilín, Minister for Culture, Arts and Leisure in the North, and from Ulster Unionist MLA, Basil McCrea to bring Irish speakers, international language law experts, government departments and civil society together in a one day event. The Irish language Act NI, which will take place in the Long Gallery, Parliament Buildings, Stormont from 9.45 – 4.30 on Wednesday 16th November 2011.

Dúirt Janet Muller, Príomhfheidhmeannach POBAL, 'Cuireann muid fáilte roimh ráitis an Aire go geatfídh an gealltanas soiléir a tugadh i gComhaontú Chill Rímhinn a chomhlíonadh. Cuireann muid fáilte, lena chois sin, roimh chinneadh Basil McCrea a bheith ina óstach go comhpháirteach don ócáid. Reachtálfar an ócáid ar 16ú Mí na Samhna le plé a dhéanamh ar fhorbairtí áitiúla, náisiúnta agus idirnáisiúnta ó fógraíocht cáipéis POBAL Acht na Gaeilge TÉ / The Irish Language Act NI sa bhliain 2006. Sa bhliain 2007 tugadh tacaíocht thar na bearta dhá moltaí comhaontaithe i dhá chomhairlíochán rialtais. Is léir gur cheart go mbeadh ról lán-nach ag rianachais agus tuairimí an Ghaeilgeora i mínlú na reachtaíochta. Sa tréimhse ó tugadh an gealltanas leis an Acht a chur i bhfeidhm, i ndlínis eile na dtíortha seo, bhí cosaint reachtaíochta do theagacha dúchasacha ag dul i bhfeabais, agus ba mhaith linn a bheith cinnte go bhfuil na hathruithe seo curtha san áireamh agus muid ag obair i dtreo Acht na Gaeilge.'

Janet Muller, CEO of POBAL said, 'We welcome the Minister's statements that the outstanding St Andrews' Agreement commitment to enact Irish language legislation must be fulfilled. We also welcome the agreement of Basil McCrea to jointly host the event. POBAL is organising our event on 16th November to examine developments locally, nationally and internationally since the 2006 publication of the POBAL document, *Acht na Gaeilge TÉ / The Irish Language Act NI*. In 2007, our agreed proposals won overwhelming support in two government public consultations. Clearly, the needs and views of Irish speakers must have a central role in informing the shape of the legislation. In the period since the promise to bring in the Act, in other parts of these islands legislative protections for indigenous languages has improved, and we want to make sure that the work towards the Irish language Act takes these changes into account.'

Among the keynote speakers at the event will be Professor Robert Dunbar (University of Aberdeen and the research project Soillse) and Professor Colin Williams (University of Cardiff), both of whom are recognised as international experts of the highest calibre. Janet Muller said, 'Both Professors Dunbar and Williams have helped advise on the drafting of language legislation in Scotland and Wales, and both have extensive international experience in Canada and the rest of Europe. Professor Williams is

Duine den tríúr saineolaí é an tOllamh Williams a thug comhairle maidir leis an straitéis 20 bliain don Ghaeilge sa deisceart. Tabharfaidh an bheirt acu a gcuid taithí fhairsing leo chug an ócáid.'

Mayor of Newry praises our Súil Charad exhibition

Mayor Charlie Casey of Newry launched **Súil Charad**, the exhibition on Irish language publications from the 18th Century to the present day, in Newry City Library at the start of October. The mayor welcomed the exhibition to the new performance space in the library. He said it was a magnificent exhibition which records the pioneering work of Irish speakers in developing a language community from the first publication, *Bolg an tSolair* in 1795, through to the online newspapers, blog sites and news sites which link the Irish speaking community around the world today.

Thug Séamas Mac Dhaibhéid, iontaobh de chuid Gaelaras Mhic Ardghail agus gníomhaí teanga de chuid Chonradh na Gaeilge Iúr Cinn Trá, breac-chuntas ar an bhaint a bhí ag daoine áitiúla le foilseachán i nGaeilge, ag dul siar na blianta agus sa lá atá inniu ann, ag tagairt go hairithe ar Thómás Ó Chonghaile as Cill Shléibhe, a bhí mar eagarthóir ar **nós* agus atá ina iriseoir ag Nuacht 24, agus Ciarán Dunbar atá ina eagarthóir ag Gaeliscéal. Thug Séamas leis roinnt cóipeanna de chuid de na foilseachán atá le feiceáil sa taispeántas agus sa leabhrán. Thug sé ardmholadh do POBAL as an obair iontach atá déanta aige chun an taispeántas seo a chur le chéile, agus mhol sé do dhaoine teacht agus am a chaitheamh ag léamh na seastán agus an leabhráin. Bhí Séamas iontach tógtha go hairithe leis an phacáiste atá curtha le chéile ag POBAL do pháistí, bunaithe ar an eolas atá sna seastáin agus sa leabhrán. Mar leasphríomhoide Choláiste Chaitríona, Ard Mhacha, d'aithin sé an tábacht atá le daoine óga a spreagadh i dtreo an fhocal scríofa.

Séamas Mac Dhaibhéid, a trustee of Gaelaras Mhic Ardghail and language activist for Newry Gaelic League, outlined the contribution of local people to Irish language publications, going back over many years and up to the present day, making particular mention of Tomás Ó Chonghaile from Killeavey, past editor of **nós* and journalist with *Nuacht 24*, and Ciarán Dunbar, editor of *Gaeliscéal*. Séamas brought with him several copies of publications mentioned in the exhibition and booklet. He praised POBAL for the excellent work by them to produce this exhibition, and urged people to come and spend some time, reading the stands and the booklet. Séamas was particularly enthused by the package put together by POBAL for children,

Dé Domhnaigh 9.10.11, ó mhóreachtraí sorcais go lámhchealaíocht le Seán Ó Faoláin agus sé míre na Fanzinis, ó Phuir a Beul le hamhránaite iomráiteacha Ghaidhlig na hAlban, go hamhránaigh aitheanta le JJ Ó Dochartaigh, ó chor Bhunscoil Phobail Feirste, go hamhránaigh ón choirdrama *Mama Mia!* a rá agus dála ó Ghaelscoil Éanna, agus ó dhramáirí Bhunscoil an tSleibhe Dhuibh go damhsa próifisiúnta ó Celtic Storm.

A great day out was had by all on Sunday 9.10.11 at POBAL's massive Rights and Revelry event in St George's Market, Belfast. Janet Muller, CEO POBAL said, 'Rights and Revelry has become the biggest single Irish language event of the year. It is a tribute to the support we have in the community that a tiny organisation like POBAL can organise such a huge gathering of people from far and near. For this one day, POBAL pulls together a unique mix of high octane Irish language arts, community celebration and a serious message - it is time for the Irish language Act. We couldn't do it without the input of numerous individuals and Irish language groups.' The event took place on the anniversary of the St Andrews' commitment to enact language legislation and the organisers are clear about its importance in giving Irish speakers and those who appreciate the language a chance to raise their voices for the premised Irish Language Act. Dozens of Irish groups came to celebrate their achievements and enjoy the sparkling line-up of Irish speaking artists and performers, music, dance, acrobatics, juggling, arts and sport.

Turner (Kennedy) and Maggie MacDonald who gave two workshops, one on Puir a Beul or Gaelic Mouth Music, and one on the Gaidhlig folk song, 'Tweed walking.' The dynamic Celtic Storm professional dancers set the stage on fire with their exciting dance routines, and acrobats Tumble Circus had the audience on the edge of their seats. Crowds of delighted children gathered to see the Fanzini Brothers, the Armagh Rhymers, juggling master Johnny Ó Phelan and stilt walker Ariel Killick - all of whom greeted and joked with their audience in Irish throughout the day. The children from Belfast Irish language schools who took to the stage from Gaeilscoil Éanna in the North of the city, from Bunscoil an tSleibhe Dhuibh and from Bunscoil Phobail Feirste in West Belfast kept the 'ahh' factor high and radio and TV presenter, Eóan Mac Aoidh Bhú, kept order for the day.
